




FIVE ELEMENTS OF A CCC PROGRAM

Your water system has just completed its sanitary survey and hopefully the questions the surveyor has asked, has given you some inspiration to take your program to the next level. Let's look at the five required elements of a Cross Connection Control Program.



1 ORDINANCE OR AUTHORITY STATEMENT

- We all have one; however has it been updated in the last few years? Your water system codes and laws are constantly changing. Water Industry Technology is very dynamic and changing overnight. You need to make sure your Ordinance or Authority Statement reflects these changes. As sanitary surveys are required for most systems every 3 years, I would recommend that systems review their Authority Statements at that time

2 PUBLIC AWARENESS & EDUCATION

- Water systems minimum requirement is a paragraph in their annual consumer confidence report. Is this enough? No. In this new age of technology we need to have a detailed web site and look into the social media (facebook, twitter) as means of providing public information and awareness.

3 TRAINED STAFF

- Water systems are required to have a ½ day of annual training for Program Administrators. I would strongly recommend all water division personnel have training and all systems have state certified program administrators. In addition, fire department personnel who operate within your water system should be trained as their equipment is not backflow protected.

4 RECORD KEEPING

- Records must be kept for a minimum of 5 years. I would recommend you transfer all records to a digital format and keep them indefinitely. These records should include assembly testing, air gap inspections, hazards surveys/inspections, backflow incidents, history of inspections, assembly locations, pictures/photos, etc. Back up and protect all PC software programs and any other digital data.

5 ONGOING ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM

- This consists of documenting actual annual testing of assemblies, hazard surveys/inspections completed, public awareness, training of staff etc, as well as any other annual activity involving the Cross Connection Control Program

In preparing to take your Cross Connection Control Program to the next level, I have listed below some important responsibilities of the program administrators which are not addressed very frequently:

- ⇒ Building Plan Review
- ⇒ Building Permit Review
- ⇒ Business License Review
- ⇒ Fire Hydrant Use Permit Program
- ⇒ Emergency Action/Response Plan- specific to Backflow Incidents
- ⇒ Web Site/Social Media (construct and update)
- ⇒ Public Awareness-do as much as you have time for and resources
- ⇒ Create Partnerships-local Health Department, neighboring water systems, building inspectors, assembly testers and local contractors of all trades

Keeping Drinking Water Safe

Many water systems operators have met the minimum requirements for a Cross connection Control program. However, even the CCC Program Administrators realize that more than the minimum is needed to achieve the goals of keeping drinking water safe

I hope this article will provide some ideas and food for thought to Jump Start Your Cross Connection Control Program.


